BIBLE READINGS

Luke 14:25-33

25 Large crowds were travelling with Jesus, and turning to them he said: 26 'If anyone comes to me and does not hate father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters – yes, even their own life – such a person cannot be my disciple. 27 And whoever does not carry their cross and follow me cannot be my disciple. 28 'Suppose one of you wants to build a tower. Won't you first sit down and estimate the cost to see if you have enough money to complete it? 29 For if you lay the foundation and are not able to finish it, everyone who sees it will ridicule you, 30 saying, "This person began to build and wasn't able to finish." 31 'Or suppose a king is about to go to war against another king. Won't he first sit down and consider whether he is able with ten thousand men to oppose the one coming against him with twenty thousand? 32 If he is not able, he will send a delegation while the other is still a long way off and will ask for terms of peace. 33 In the same way, those of you who do not give up everything you have cannot be my disciples.

Heroes putting their trust in God

Baptisms are always a joyful occasion, and at their heart there is our identification with Jesus Christ as our Lord (our boss - see below). Firstly as we go down into the waters, we identify ourselves as following Jesus into dying to all that separates us from God. That's important because Jesus' death is about the forgiveness he has won for us on the cross by taking our place, dying instead of us. Absorbing God's wrath himself, so that we don't. The cross is the centre point of forgiveness and baptism is a picture of it. Baptism is also a picture of resurrection, of new life in Christ and the solid hope for the future that it brings. No longer do we live in slavery to sin, instead we are free to serve a new master, free as a servant of Christ and as a child of God. Last Sunday as an extension of our All Together Sunday Service at Wick Hall the church baptised Shepherd and Catherine, but with the sea as the font there was more water than usual. We each have a unique story to tell of God calling us into this new life in Christ on Sunday over the wind and the waves we heard Shepherd's testimony with the last line changed back to his own words (if you were there on Sunday you will know that I shared it on Shepherd's behalf and he was concerned when he realised that I had changed the last sentence and therefore it was no longer in his own words.

"I have always known God because I go to church with my family and we sometimes read the bible and pray at home. One evening after reading the bible my parents prayed with me to say sorry to God for all the things I had done wrong in my life and accept Jesus' as my Saviour and Lord, that means I let Jesus be my boss and I made the decision to listen to Him. I know God is real because when I ask him questions he answers. He tells me in my heart what is the right thing to do. He answered my prayer when I asked to see what He looks like. He helped me find my toys when I lost them. He helped me be kind to my friends and be less afraid when I am alone. I want to get baptised because I want to make it clear that I want to follow Jesus. I know that He loves me with a powerful and never ending love. At New Wine, God helped me figure out that the greatest treasure in life is not an object but love, the Holy Spirit and faith in the Lord. I am really excited to get baptised today in the sea!" (Shepherd, aged 9, baptised on his 9th birthday)

Let's pray for Shepherd, for Catherine, and ourselves that we would fight valiantly as disciples of Christ against sin, the world and the devil, and remain faithful to Christ to the end of our lives, by finishing the race he has set before us.
