HYMN WILL BE ON THE SERVICE SHEET

COLLECT for The Second Sunday before Advent

Heavenly Lord, you long for the world's salvation: stir us from apathy, restrain us from excess and revive in us new hope that all creation will one day be healed in Jesus Christ our Lord.

In Isaiah 45 we hear God's remarkable invitation: 'Turn to me and be saved... for I am God, and there is no other.' It's a reminder that the God who created the world also calls every one of us to find our hope and security in Him alone.

Someone recently told me about their shed roof, which finally blew off after repeated patching. They admitted that the problem was that they were trying to patch on rotten timber. It struck me that many of us try to build our lives on things that can't hold, perhaps it's success, busyness, or simply our own strength. Eventually the storms show us we need a firmer foundation.

Isaiah points us to that foundation: the Lord Himself, who speaks truth, offers salvation, and has revealed Himself fully in Jesus. He alone is solid ground.

Pause now and turn again to Him and do so this week, trusting His strength and inviting others to do the same.

BIBLE READINGS

Isaiah 45:18-25

18 For this is what the Lord says – he who created the heavens, he is God; he who fashioned and made the earth, he founded it; he did not create it to be empty, but formed it to be inhabited – he says: 'I am the Lord, and there is no other. 19 I have not spoken in secret, from somewhere in a land of darkness; I have not said to Jacob's descendants, "Seek me in vain." I, the Lord, speak the truth; I declare what is right. 20 'Gather together and come; assemble, you fugitives from the nations. Ignorant are those who carry about idols of wood, who pray to gods that cannot save. 21 Declare what is to be, present

it – let them take counsel together. Who foretold this long ago, who declared it from the distant past? Was it not I, the Lord? And there is no God apart from me, a righteous God and a Saviour; there is none but me. 22 'Turn to me and be saved, all you ends of the earth; for I am God, and there is no other. 23 By myself I have sworn, my mouth has uttered in all integrity a word that will not be revoked: before me every knee will bow; by me every tongue will swear. 24 They will say of me, "In the Lord alone are deliverance and strength."' All who have raged against him will come to him and be put to shame. 25 But all the descendants of Israel will find deliverance in the Lord and will make their boast in him.
